BAI Striped, colourful patterns hand-woven aprons, topogray of rural landscapes, iconic ld and rich colours found in ligious murals – all travel rough Suzanna Pejoska's comcanvases with an intensity belies her humble origins.

An artist from Aveyron, France, loska's outstanding collection 37 paintings on contemporary is on display at the Majlis lery until November 12.

Her work is profoundly influced by her vibrant memories of ditional dresses worn by the acedonian village women and, ore particularly, the colourful ear patterns seen on aprons.

Born in Macedonia, her family migrated to France when she was three and that was when her creative spirit started taking form. Obsessed with drawing from an early age, she began her tryst with art by copying artworks of some famous artists. Her first painting was linked to the design of a traditional costume. Having received an overwhelming response to her first exhibition at Normandy in France, she was inspired and motivated into holding her first solo exhibition at Nimes in France, Since then, she has held displays at around 18 different places across France, Italy, Spain, Germany, England and finally Dubai.

Linking tradition with modernity, childhood with adulthood, Pejoska works on both abstract and figurative patterns.

Pejoska, who has also ventured into the world of diptych art - a combination of two painting with a three-dimensional effective seemed optimistic about his stint in Dubai: "Dubai is a greeplace of art and I am sure the my art will match the culture this vibrant city."

Pejoska plans to exhibit he paintings in Abu Dhabi, Lond and Moscow next year.
